Children who are trafficked rarely escape, and many continue to be trafficked as young adults. OEW Hope House® offers three models of residential care for youth age 17-24, as well as intensive community based services for children and young adults. Our holistic, trauma-informed model of care offers individualized support for each young survivor.



OUR IMPACT

Days and nights of 24/7 therapeutic aftercare and emergency housing for young survivors of sexual exploitation and trafficking who had no safe home to which to return.

5,976

Nutritious meals and snacks for young survivors in our care.

7,320

Therapeutic interventions including professional counseling, alternative therapies (equine assisted, horticulture, art, music), life skills training sessions (Fields of Hope™), mentoring, tutoring and coaching sessions, trauma healing workshops and case management support.

“When I arrived at OEW Hope House®, I was scared, angry and hurting. I didn’t trust anyone, and I was always harming myself. I had no desire to be alive. I left 3-4 times, but each time y’all have accepted me with arms wide open and each time I’ve gotten stronger. Now, I’m going on 6 months clean from drugs and self-harm and my eating disorder is in remission. I’ve learned how to advocate for myself, and I’ve learned how to set boundaries... I have confidence in myself. OEW will always be my first home and I am thankful for the lessons y’all have taught me and how y’all stand by me no matter what. Thank y’all so much for everything.”

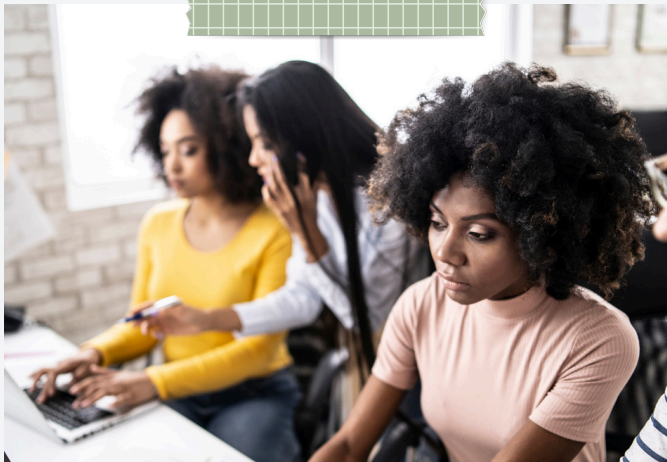

For more than a decade, the Fields of Hope® work empowerment program has helped young women survivors develop critical life skills and job skills. Products are handmade by survivors and support staff. All proceeds help provide a home, life skills training and internship experiences for the survivors in the program!

WHISPERS OF HOPE CURRICULUM

The heart of the program is our survivor-inspired curriculum, Whispers of Hope, which gives survivors challenging learning opportunities and leadership training.

- Offers survivors a paid educational fellowship program.
- Survivors create vision maps for their future.
- Participants learn leadership skills, job skills and financial skills that lead to economic independence.

YOUTH4ABOLITION®

Celebrating 10 years of impact

Youth4Abolition® (Y4A) is a youth-led, peer-to-peer, human trafficking prevention and awareness program focused on empowering our nation's youth to protect themselves, educate their friends and share their knowledge and skills throughout their communities.

A generation of young people committed to ending human trafficking.

The Youth4Abolition® curriculum is a powerful seven-part human trafficking curriculum, designed by award-winning educators and curriculum specialists. It is eye-opening, impactful, and effective in preventing Domestic Minor Sex Trafficking (DMST).

Y4A sets up chapters in high schools, colleges and churches across North and South Carolina. Each chapter is run by a dedicated student leader with the help of their Y4A Coach and Adult Sponsor. Once the Chapter President is trained on our state-of-the-art curriculum, they deliver the information to their peers throughout the year.

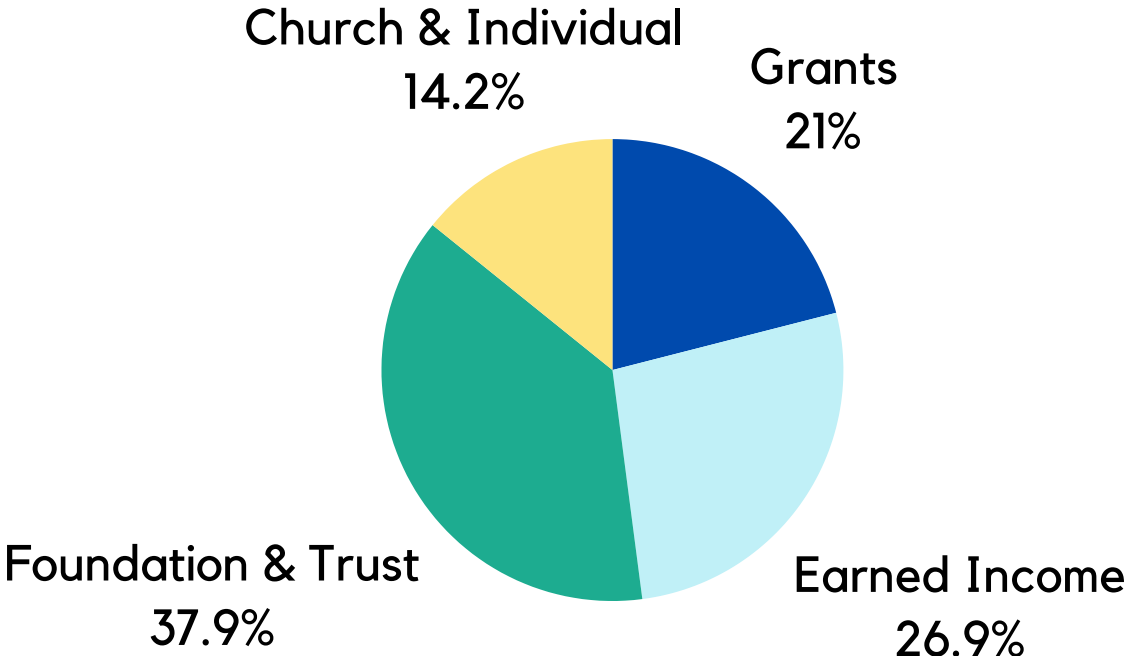

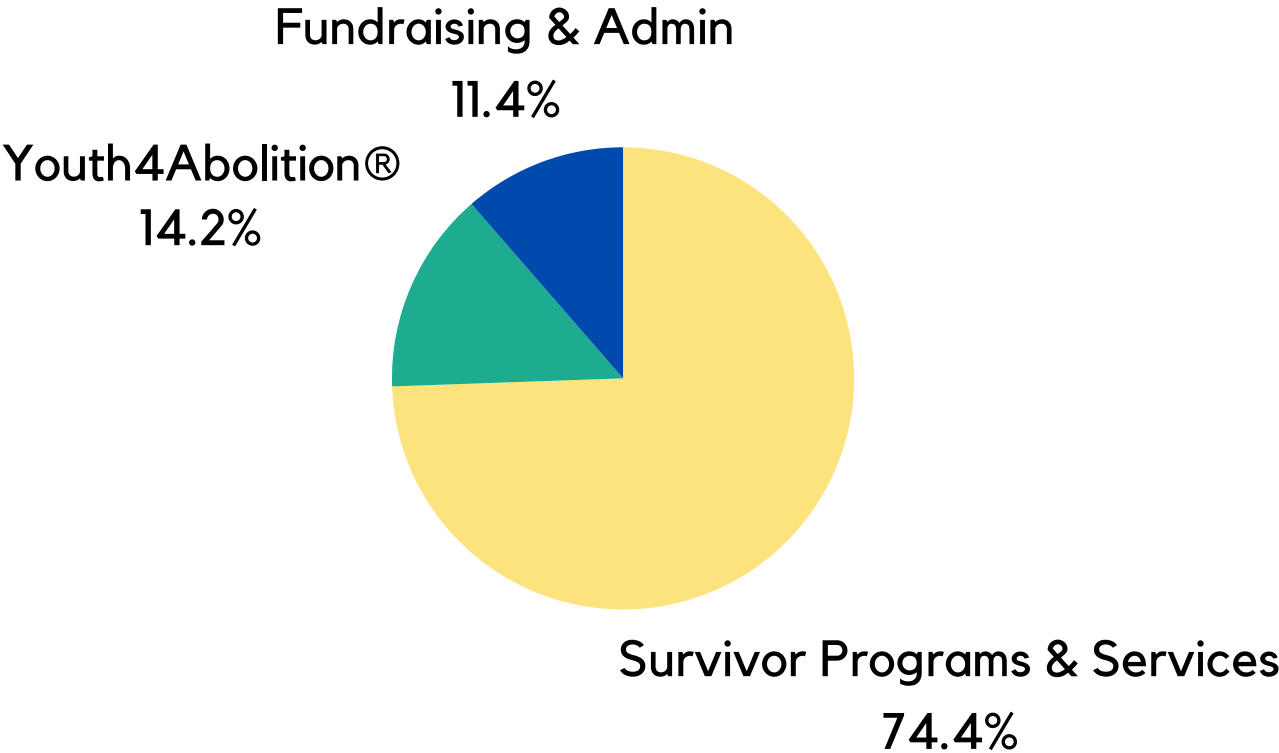
